Barry Madison is a 32 year veteran of the Colorado Springs Fire Department, currently serving as the Station Captain at Fire Station 19, which is responsible for all staffing within the CSFD. As the staffing program manager, he oversees daily staffing for more than 400 firefighters, ensuring the proper number of trained staff are on duty every day.

Captain Madison joined the CSFD in 1987, spending five years as a firefighter before promoting to positions first as a Driver/Engineer, and then Lieutenant. He was promoted to Captain in 2014 and from 2014 to 2016, also served as the Deputy Fire Marshal for the department. He has played a key role in numerous positions within the fire department, spending nineteen years on the Apparatus Committee (six as the committee chair) and serving two years as the Driver Coordinator and on the Safety Committee. He has been a Fire Inspector since 2015.

Over more than three decades, Captain Madison has fulfilled numerous roles, all requiring extraordinary commitment and unique skill sets. He has provided countless hours of mentorship and guidance to dozens of CSFD members who have gone on to be successful. His attitude, leadership, and guidance have been instrumental in shaping the careers of our firefighters.

Captain Madison voluntarily dedicates his time to functions beyond the scope of his assigned duties. As a Deputy Fire Marshal, he created a productive environment which proved to be highly effective, even with limited staff. He regularly shares his knowledge and passion for the fire service with his subordinates and peers and is known for driving positive change and fostering an environment of unity and teamwork. He has been recognized for his role in the Castle West, Waldo Canyon, and Black Forest fires, and received the CSFD Medal of Distinguished Service for his initiative and ongoing commitment to excellence. The skills and experience he contributes to every role he fills have made him a valuable asset to the Fire Department team.

Captain Madison was a journeyman plumber before joining the CSFD and is credited with installing many, many dishwashers and sprinkler lines at our stations. He is truly a jack of all trades!
